LED Streetlight Project:

Adam reached out to Affinity for an update on when the lighting plan review would be available and ready for discussion. Multiple contacts from Affinity responded that they will be ready next week and will send out an invite to the Energy Commission and all relevant town department heads for a remote meeting to finalize project details.

EV Charging stations:

Brett reached out to DOT and the Central NH Planning commission to get an update on what our next steps should be and when/what funding will be available. Steph Alexander was given as a potential contact for Hillsborough moving forward. The funding is currently at the state planning stages and will not have any further information available until at least august when the state has finalized plans.

Brett mentioned he has found multiple companies that can provide DC fast charge stations through onsite battery banks without the need for three phase power. Brett explained the modular design adds the benefits of being movable, easily setup in a day, and allows for more diverse location possibilities.

Community Power:

Sue will be attending a meeting with the PUC where they will be discussing the allowance of community power projects for individual municipalities.

Sue asked the commission if she should put the Energy commission on the service list of dockets DE 21-142, DE 21-136, DE 21-141, and DE 21-143 that will provide the board with automatic email updates to any pending changes to those dockets that reference community power projects. Brett suggested that it would be a good idea in order to stay more informed and up to date, and that we can always unsubscribe if it becomes an avalanche of information. Adam agreed. Sue will add the commission to the service list.

Weatherization Project:

Brett reiterated that no new available funding has been granted or replenished by the state.

Brett suggested removing one of the July meetings due to the fact that most state funding projects are on hold.

Sue made a motion to cancel the July 14th meeting, Adam Seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Sue motioned to adjourn, Adam Seconded.
